Undergraduate Requirements (100-400 courses)

Reading Instructions:

Graduate Requirements (500-600 courses)

Reading Instructions:

Two Primary Textbooks: Read the textbook(s) (or e-text(s)) in their entirety. Keep a dictionary nearby (for some reading you will need a Bible/Theological dictionary) and look up any words you are unfamiliar with. Listen to all MP3 lectures, if applicable.

Assignments:

Collateral Reading: 400 pages
